Dr Sinéad Ní Bhraonáin is a Consultant in Emergency Medicine working at Royal Prince Alfred Hospital Sydney. Royal Prince Alfred Hospital is a large teaching hospital, a quaternary referral centre and a major trauma centre in Sydney. She is also the clinical director of the Sydney Local Health District Demand Management Unit.

Sinéad is a proud past student of Gaelscoil and Gaelcholáiste Cheatharlach and a 2006 graduate of the Royal College of Surgeons in Ireland (RCSI). She commenced Emergency Medicine Training in Ireland after internship and completed her specialist training in Emergency Medicine in Ireland from RCSI in 2015. She moved to Australia after completing her Emergency Medicine Specialist Training in January 2016 to work for NSW Ambulance Helicopter Rescue Service.
