Gillian Keating

Gillian Keating is a co-founder of the highly successful and award winning I-WISH (Inspiring Women in Stem) social enterprise, which is an initiative to inspire young women to consider careers in Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths (STEM). She is also adjunct Professor in the College of Business and Law at University College Cork (UCC) and in 2017 received an Alumni Achievement Award from UCC.



Dr Cliona Ni Cheallaigh

Dr Cliona Ni Cheallaigh is a Consultant in Infectious Diseases and General Medicine in St James's Hospital, Dublin, and Clinical Senior Lecturer in the Dept of Clinical Medicine, TCD. She is the Clinical Lead of a pilot Inclusion Health Service in St James's Hospital dedicated to improving access to specialist hospital care for socially excluded individuals. Her research seeks to look at the effect of social exclusion on health from a number of perspectives, and includes work on health systems design and evaluation, work funded by the HRB on premature ageing in homeless adults and work on the effect of social exclusion on the immune system.



Dr Emma Keelan

Dr Emma Keelan is an ST5 respiratory trainee in Northern Ireland with an MA in Global Health from the University of Manchester (at the Humanitarian and Conflict Research Institute). Dr Keelan has experience of delivering healthcare within the Occupied Palestinian territories given her role as a volunteer with Physicians for Human Rights. Previously she also worked with the Palestinian Medical Relief Society and has a number of peer reviewed publications in this area. Currently Dr Keelan's research interests are regarding the issue of resilience, specifically within the context of Palestinian women.

Aisling qualified in 2011 having studied in Trinity College (LLB Ling. Franc) and The Law Society of Ireland. She has experience of working for two leading healthcare defence practices in Dublin – Matheson and Hayes Solicitors.

Aisling's experience to date in the context of clinical negligence claims includes investigating civil claims ranging from comparatively minor to catastrophic injuries and advising on appropriate case strategy. Her particular interest lies in the regulatory sphere and advising doctors who are the subject of complaints. She was the lead defence solicitor in a high profile Medical Council Fitness to Practise Inquiry concerning wrong site surgery and in subsequent, successful Judicial Review proceedings which challenged the outcome of that Inquiry and which changed the landscape of regulatory law in Ireland.

Aisling also previously worked as In-House Legal Advisor to the Medical Council of Ireland. She has an excellent and rounded knowledge of the medico legal environment in Ireland and of the particular challenges and issues associated with regulatory and disciplinary proceedings.



Sibéal Carolan

A Workforce Development Lead in the Workplace Health and Wellbeing Unit in the HSE, Sibéal holds an MSc in Nursing from TCD and a postgraduate diploma in Clinical Health Sciences Education, Diploma in Executive Coaching and Diploma in Mental Health and Wellbeing Coaching. She was a Programme Director (MSc Leadership) at the Institute of Leadership in RCSI from 2008 to 2016.
